Prepare a disaster kit for your pet including a week's supply of food/water, carrier, leash, medications, sanitation materials, health records, veterinarian contact information, photo of your pet and chew toys.



Locate a safe place to take your pet in an emergency.





Never leave pets behind in vehicles, tethered or crated without you.



Disasters are stressful for pets.
Comfort your pet with kind words
and lots of hugs. If your pet's behavior
changes due to the stress of the
disaster, keep them away from other
animals and strangers.



If your pet is injured, try not to move them more than necessary. Call a veterinarian as soon as possible.





If your pet is missing, call your local shelter and animal control agencies.
