	Recommended vaccinations on a vet-approved schedule Help protect your kitty against disease.
	Vet-recommended parasite control Help your kitty avoid worms, fleas, and other parasites.
	A collar and ID tags Tip: You should be able to slip a finger under your kitty's collar.
	<b>Kitten food (and maybe treats!)</b> Kittens need special kitten food. Keep treats down to a few a day, please.
	<b>Kitty litter and litter box</b> Pick a box big enough for your kitty to turn around without hitting the sides, and start with unscented, non-clumping litter.
	Kitty bed Pick a soft bed to fit your kitty — don't keep it next to the litter box, please.
	A crate or soft-sided carrier Be sure you have a safe way to travel or take your kitty to the vet.
	Kitten-safe toys Kittens love playtime!
	Tooth-cleaning supplies Help your cat avoid dental disease, starting when they're wee.
	Scratching post or board Cats need to scratch to help stretch and tone their muscles.
	Cat trees for climbing Give your kitten a safe space to hang out and watch the action.
More supplies for your kitten	
	Pet gates to keep pets separate until they're ready to make friends.
	Pet-safe cleaning supplies to clean up accidents.
	Grooming supplies like cat brushes and nail trimmers.
